

Pacific the Spanish lake | José Bonnet Casciaro

The discovery of the Pacific, the largest ocean on Earth, almost entirely realised by Spanish ships, is one the greatest man-made achievement in history. Oskar Spate, an Australian historian, called this ocean “Pacific. The Spanish lake”. However, this achievement was mostly unnoticed, because of the explorations and the discovery of America, as its divulgation was irrelevant. We can't contemplate something unknown. The lack of awareness on that immensity made those journeys impossible. Nonetheless, the crew assumed the risk. Many ships used to reach the shores with no alive crew. They tried, by the way, thinking about what Christopher Columbus said: “The sea will grant each man new hope, and sleep will bring dreams of home”.
